Canadian Spiritualist History Calgary First Milestone 2021 by Reverend Ella Groves

The Calgary First Spiritualist Church (CFSC) celebrated its 101st
Anniversary on Sunday, November 21, 2021.

Sometime prior to 1915, a medium by the name of Ada Garrard had a dream of starting a Spiritualist group; she put an ad in the local Calgary paper inviting interested people to come to a meeting. There was a great deal of interest and soon a body of people grew, and it wasn't long before the parents had a dream. They wanted an opportunity for their children to be taught Spiritualist values and principles based on the teachings of Andrew Jackson Davis. They formed a branch of the Children's Progressive Lyceum and got manuals sent out from England. There were 25 to 30 children who attended the Lyceum in rented halls in Calgary.

Before long, these visionary
Spiritualists had an even grander
dream. They wanted their own church
and on November 25 of 1920 the
Government of Alberta incorporated
the Calgary First Spiritualist Church.
They bought a small building, a
Moravian Church located on the corner
of 7th Avenue and 5th Street, Southeast.
The bell tower was removed, but the
stained-glass windows were left intact,
and a front porch was added.



Now they had a place to hold the Lyceum, church services and social events. They didn't

stop dreaming; the congregation put their energy into fundraising and in 1929 they burned the mortgage. The dream of having a permanent center for Spiritualists to gather and serve the community was a reality.

The small church did not have main floor bathrooms, nor did it have a

kitchen. There was a bathroom in the basement but to get to it, one had to slide a heavy pew back, open a trap door and then descend a very steep ladder-like staircase. Holding fund raising teas, potluck suppers, whist drives and the annual Christmas Party had its challenges because there was no kitchen. Not many people owned cars in those days so turkeys and hams, pots of mashed potatoes and pies had to be cooked at home and taken to the church on city buses.

The Ladies League dreamed about having an annex with a real kitchen and main floor bathrooms. They worked hard and raised enough money so that their vision became a reality. However, it didn't turn out quite the way they expected. Rev. Eleanor Collette was the one collaborating with the contractor. Eleanor had a strong English accent, and the contractor wasn't too clear about his English. The contractor asked what colour he was to

paint the kitchen and Eleanor told him to paint it a 'light green'. It was a shock when people walked in and found their lovely new kitchen had been painted a bilious 'lime green'.

Now across the street at City Hall there were politicians dreaming dreams with a vision of urban renewal. The city was buying all the nearby little bungalows and houses with their rose gardens and picket fences. Since the church board did not wish to part with their property, the word EXPROPRIATION loomed over the church. It was an aging *Spiritualist population running the* church by the late 1960's and many of the mediums and church members had passed onto their reward or were retired. Despite the huge amount of work and effort it would take, there were still those who dreamed the dream and had the vision to continue.

In 1974 the church renovated a side-by-side duplex. It was a suitable location for the church as it was on a corner lot in a pleasant suburb and on a bus line. By the way, the Ladies League made sure that the new building had two kitchens, one upstairs and one downstairs.

There was a seventeen-year period in the history of the CFSC when the running of the church fell under the control of one person. The constitution and Roberts Rules, annual elections for Board Members and the opportunity for new members to join the church, were cast aside. There seemed to be no vision for the future of the church. By the late 1980's, the building had fallen into a state of disrepair, the bank account was empty, and the number of people attending services dwindled. The dynamic group energy and vision that kept the church alive and vibrant was gone.

Fortunately, in 1980 David and Avril Oliver had moved to Calgary. David was a long-time Spiritualist from

England and started to attend circles at the CFSC. Later, in the 1990's he was ordained as a minister and people began to look to him for leadership. David and Avril were familiar with how Spiritualist churches were organized and run in England, and Avril was an excellent organizer and familiar with the process of running democratic meetings.

In 1992 the democracy of the church was restored. The 1920 constitution was reinstated. Once again members were allowed to join the church and there was an elected board. With a growing membership and a vision shared by the Olivers, members of my family and other Spiritualists, new dreams were dreamed, new visions were formed. Like the phoenix the spirit of the church rose from the ashes and the church moved forward with new vibrancy into the 21st century.

It wasn't long before there were so many activities that the church formed

committees to oversee the many educational and training programs, outreach activities, building and maintenance requirements, fundraising, social events and much more. The ministry established an Introduction to Spiritualism Course for new members, and the SCC provided ministerial programs thus expanding the number of ordained church ministers

The CFSC had planned to celebrate its centennial throughout the year of 2020 starting in January. Fortunately, two special projects were completed before the pandemic resulted in the church having to close its doors for 17 months. Guidance for Life's Journey was a collection of inspirational and enlightening talks given at Sunday services and published in a commemorative book. A theatrical

performance, **Spirited Women**, was written and performed based on an encounter of two women, Emma Hardinge Britten and Madame Helena Blavatsky, reminiscing about their lives as pioneer Spiritualists.



Once again, the church is open and due to sound church management and dedicated volunteers it

does not have to rise like the phoenix from the ashes. Gratitude and appreciation go to those who have stepped forward to keep the dream of the CFSC pioneers alive.







This training will be presented in parts and is tailored to your By-Laws, letters patent, Mission Statement and the roles of Pastor and Board members. A




